RULES

Enter your team name in the box at the top of the quiz sheet. Starting from question 1 in the Anagrams Section, wait for the Quizmaster to give you the clue for each anagram. Each question is worth ONE point unless the Quizmaster decides otherwise.

Use the Quiz Notes area of this quiz sheet to make notes on questions you cannot immediately answer. Ask the Quizmaster to repeat a question if you didn't hear or understand it.

Marking: At the end of the quiz all teams or players exchange quiz sheets and mark each others answers. Incorrect spelling and minor mistakes in the answers are usually acceptable EXCEPT where the Quizmaster insists it must be spelt correctly. Each correct answer is worth ONE point, each incorrect answer is worth 0 points, EXCEPT where the Quizmaster has decided otherwise. Enter the total score for each round in the Score card at the bottom right of the quiz sheet then add up and enter the total score.

Once the quiz sheets have been marked they are returned to their respective teams. Check that you agree with the marking and that the total score is correct. If you think the sheet is marked or scored incorrectly ask the Quizmaster to adjudicate. The Quizmaster's decision is final.

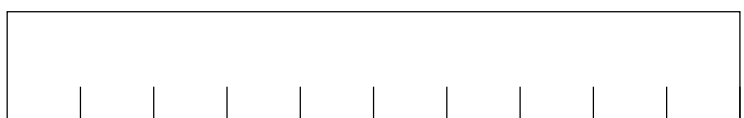

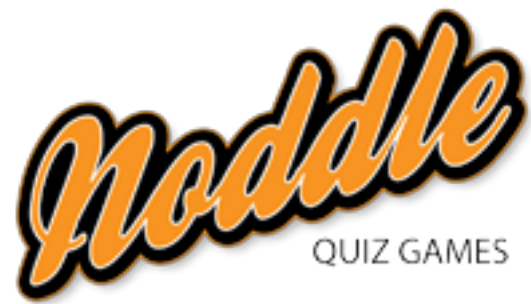

Hosting a Noddle Quiz

Noddle quiz games are designed to be as simple and straightforward to host as possible. There are however a few things you need to bear in mind when hosting a quiz.

Delivery: Can all the players/teams hear you? You'll need to speak clearly and confidently in order to be heard and not have to repeat the questions. If the quiz venue is big, you should use a microphone and public address system. Make sure it works before the quiz begins. Read each question out twice with the question number.

Timing: Tell the players when the quiz will start. Leave enough time between questions, around 45 seconds thinking time is usually enough. Take a 15 minute break at the end of the Picture Round. The whole quiz, including a break and marking should take 1 and a half to 2 hours.

Peeking: Your Question & Answer pages are designed so that the quiz players cannot easily see their contents. However, you need to be careful not to let the players see the questions or answers before or after they are read. Put them inside an A4 folio for extra safety and keep the quiz fair!

Prizes: Most pub quizzes have a nominal entry fee per player e.g. £ 1. The winning team wins the pot. However, you can organise this any way you like. For example you could make the quiz free and provide your own prizes. Please bear in mind that if the players are paying to be in the quiz then you need to make it worth winning.

Scoring: As Quizmaster you have ultimate control over how the quiz is presented, scored and marked. By default, each correct answer gains one point however, you could allow more points for questions you may think are particularly difficult or even subtract points for getting a question wrong. It's up to you although please bear in mind that complicated scoring makes mistakes in the marking more likely.

Disputes: In the event that a player or team challenges the answer to a question, incorrect marking or spelling, you as Quizmaster have the final decision on whether to allow the answer or not. For example you can, if you wish, allow an incorrectly spelt answer which has been marked as wrong.

Cheating: The best way to stop most cheating, for example team members using mobile phones etc. to look up answers on the internet or using text messaging, is to just recommend that they don't use them whilst the quiz is in progress. If a player needs to leave the room, ask them to leave the device on their table. There isn't a foolproof way to stop cheating, as long as you explain that in the spirit of fairness it is not allowed that should be enough.

Instructions

1. Collect the entry money (if any) from each player. If subsequent players join a team after the quiz has started you'll also need to collect the entry money from them. Give each team a quiz sheet and pens.

2. Tell the teams how long they have before the quiz starts.

3. Explain the rules, how long the quiz will take then read out the first 26 questions twice each.

4. Take a break.

5. Read out questions 27 to 50 twice each.

6. At the end, repeat any questions on request.

7. Collect the quiz sheets and distribute them amongst the teams, make sure you don't give a team back their own quiz sheet!. You can mark the quiz yourself although it is MUCH quicker for teams to mark each others sheets.

8. Read out the answers twice each, then ask the teams to add up the total score.

9. Collect the quiz sheets, note each team name and their score, then give the sheets back to the original teams.

10. Give the teams time to absorb their score and check for mistakes in the marking. Resolve any disputes.

- 11a. If there is a clear winning team read out the scores from lowest to highest.

- 11b. If there is a draw between two more teams read out the tiebreaker question, this is always a number based guess so the nearest to the correct answer wins. Collect the quiz sheets again and announce which team was nearest to the correct answer.

12. Distribute the prizes (if any). You can also offer extra prizes or cash to the winners or runner's up.

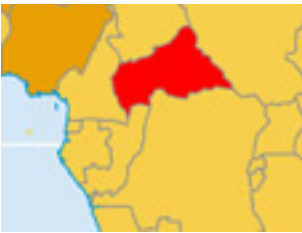

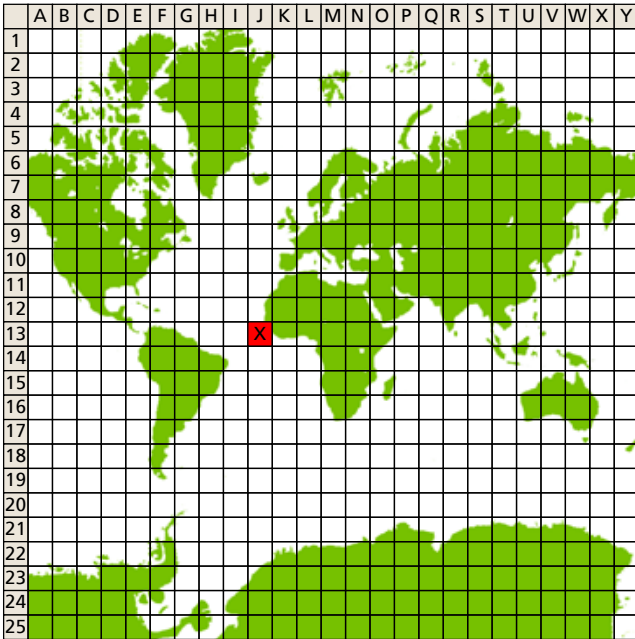
